Teaching Learning

A week-long Faculty Development Program was conducted to enhance the pedagogical and research capabilities of 60 faculty members, contributing to their professional growth.

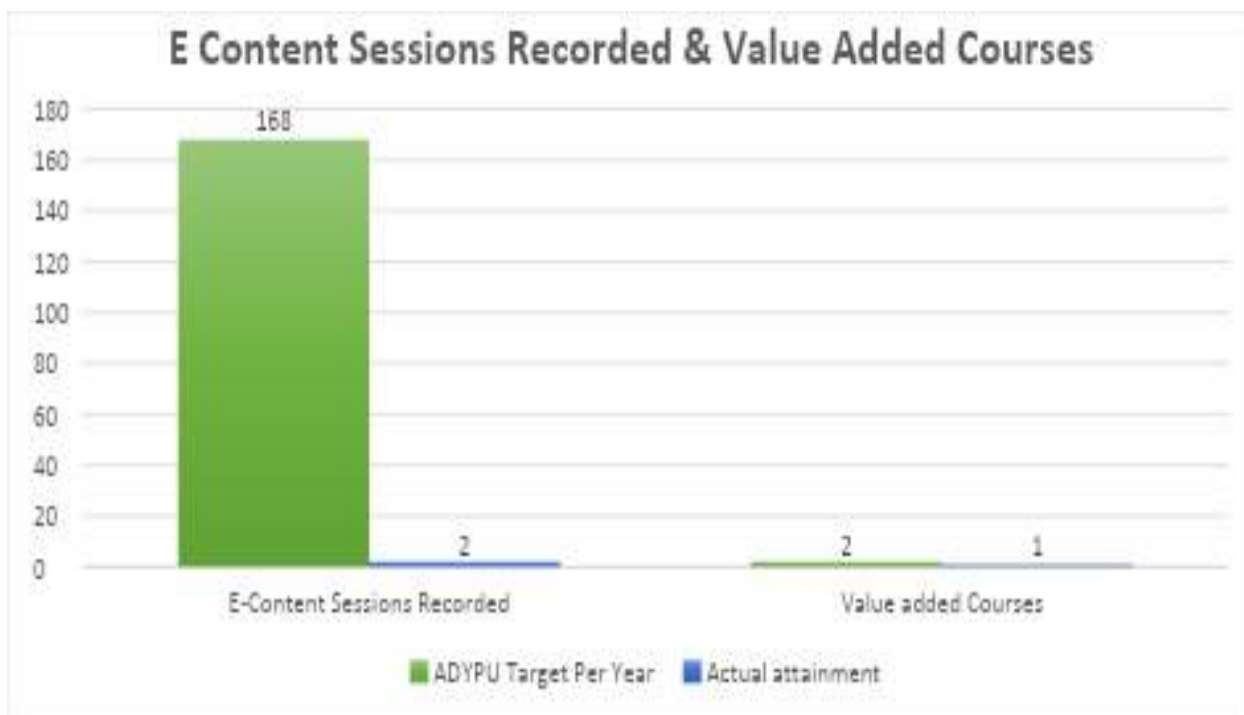
Online Teaching-Learning Facilities

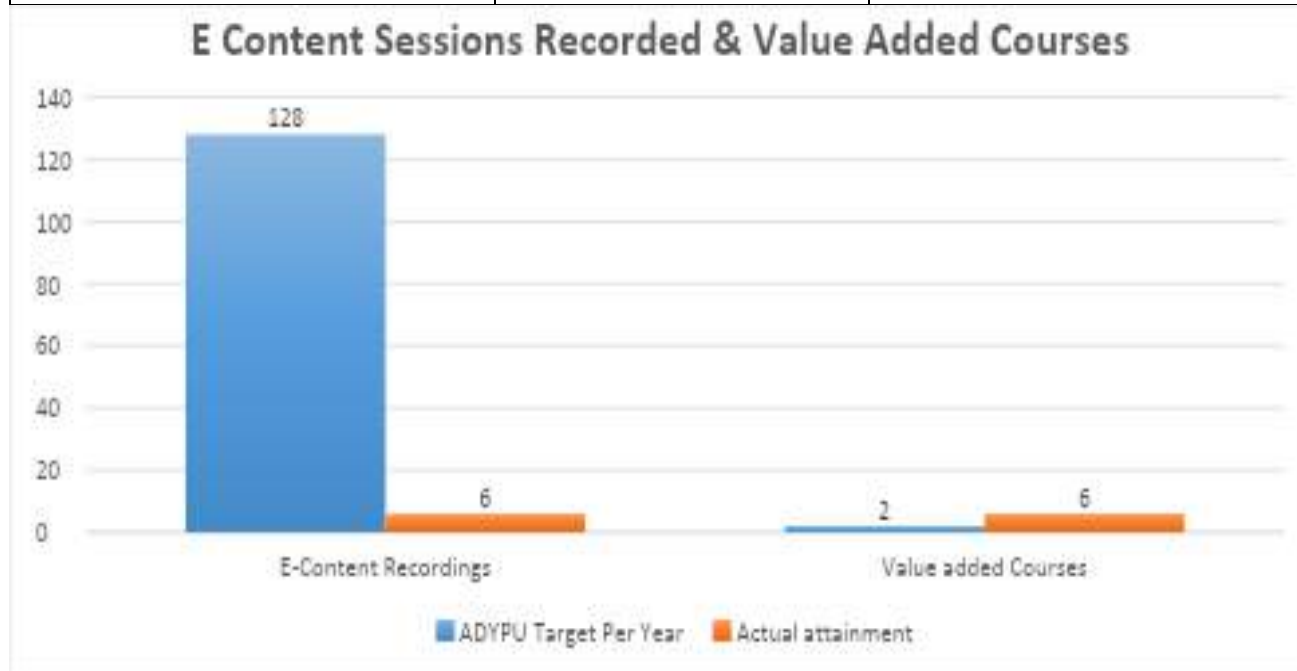

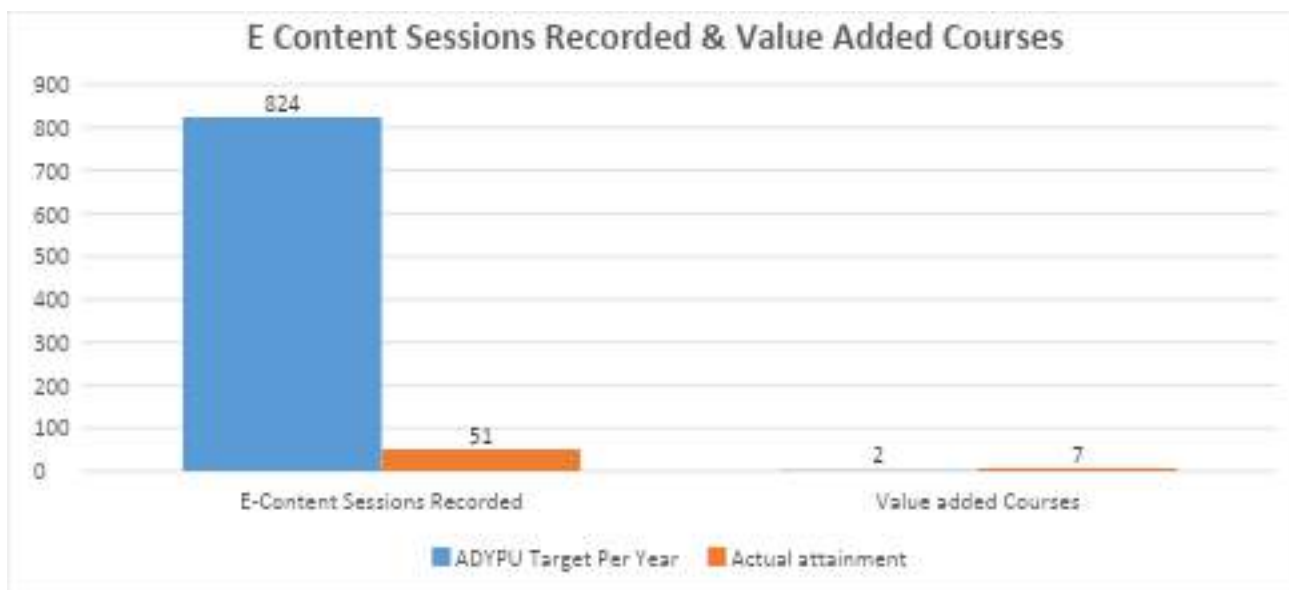

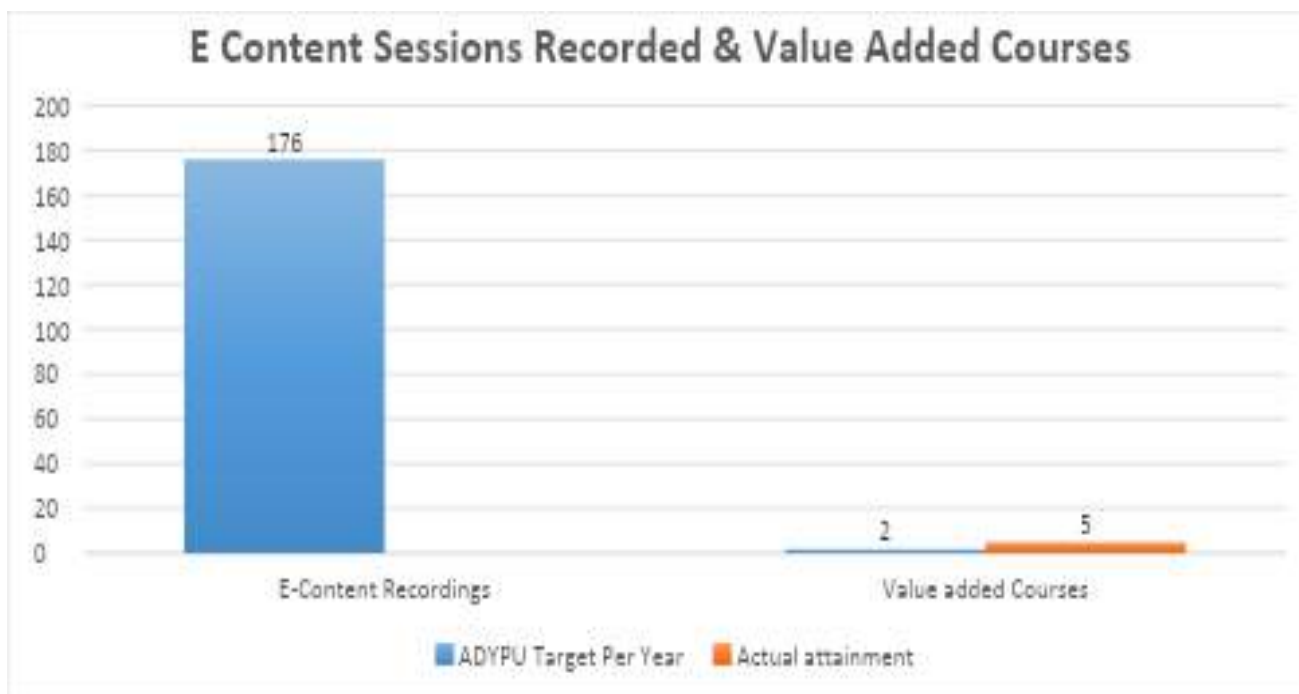
3. School of Engineering

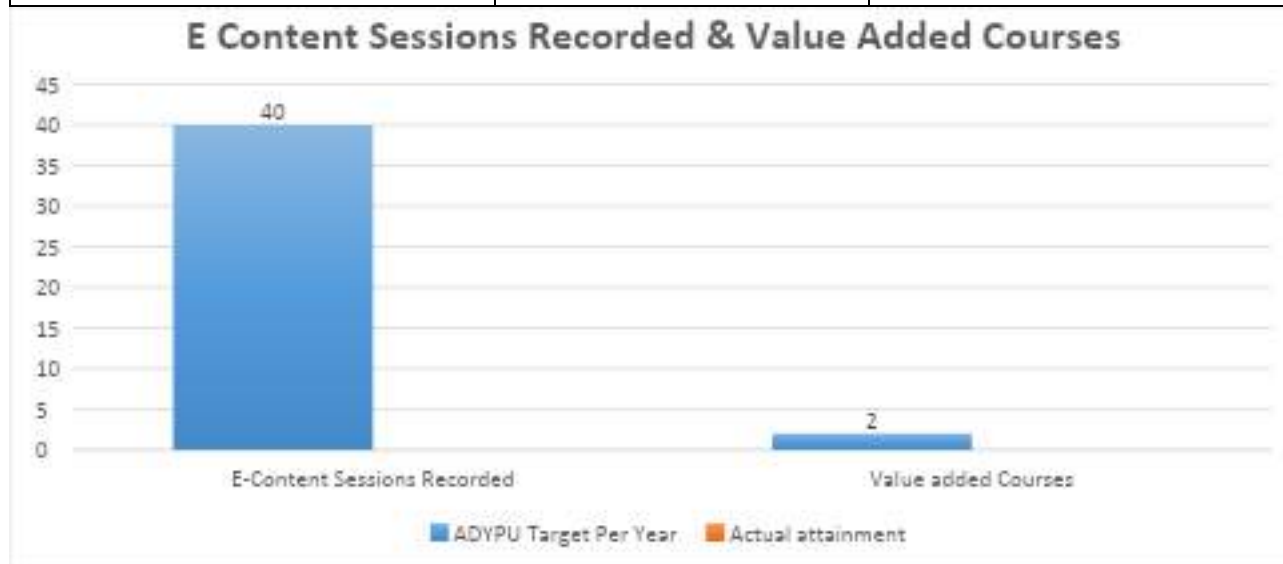

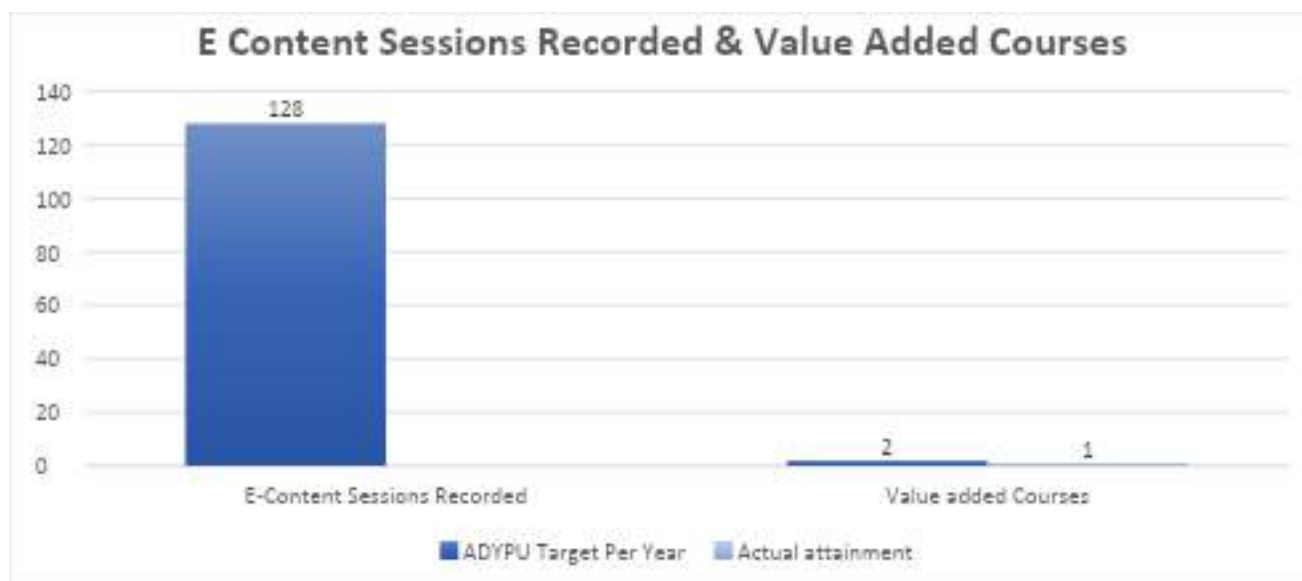
5. School of Hotel Management

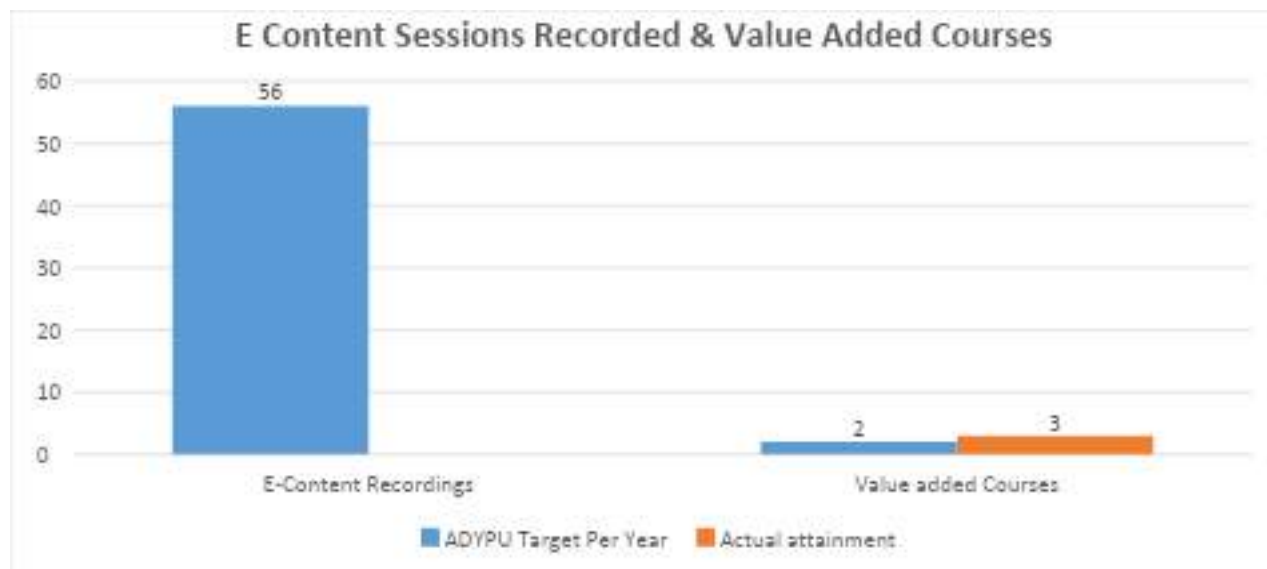

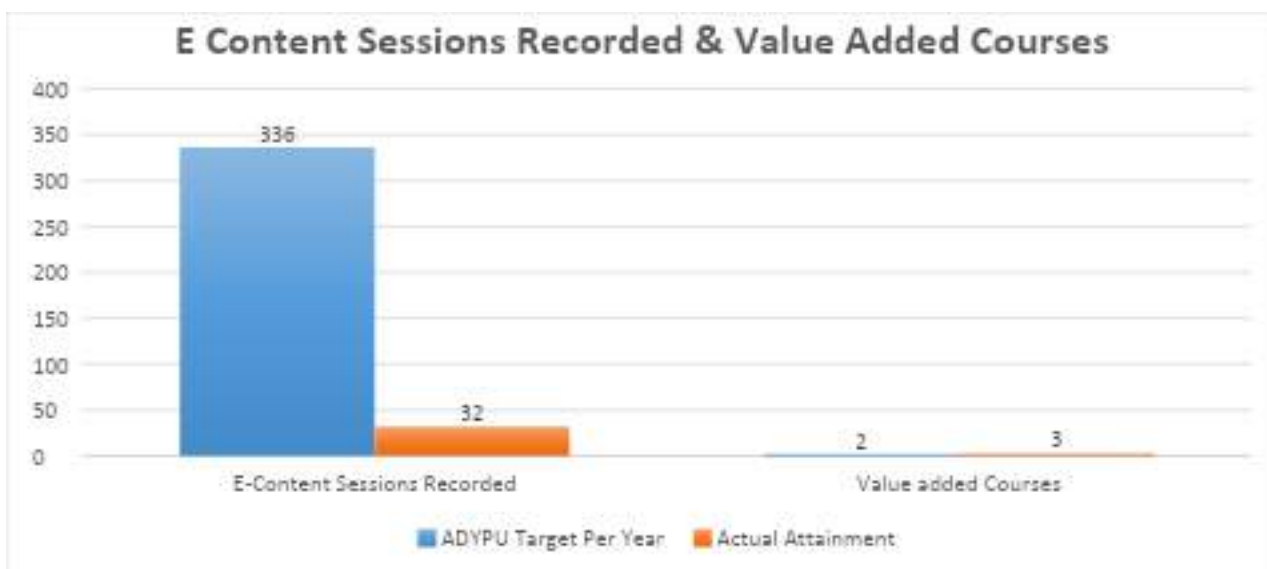

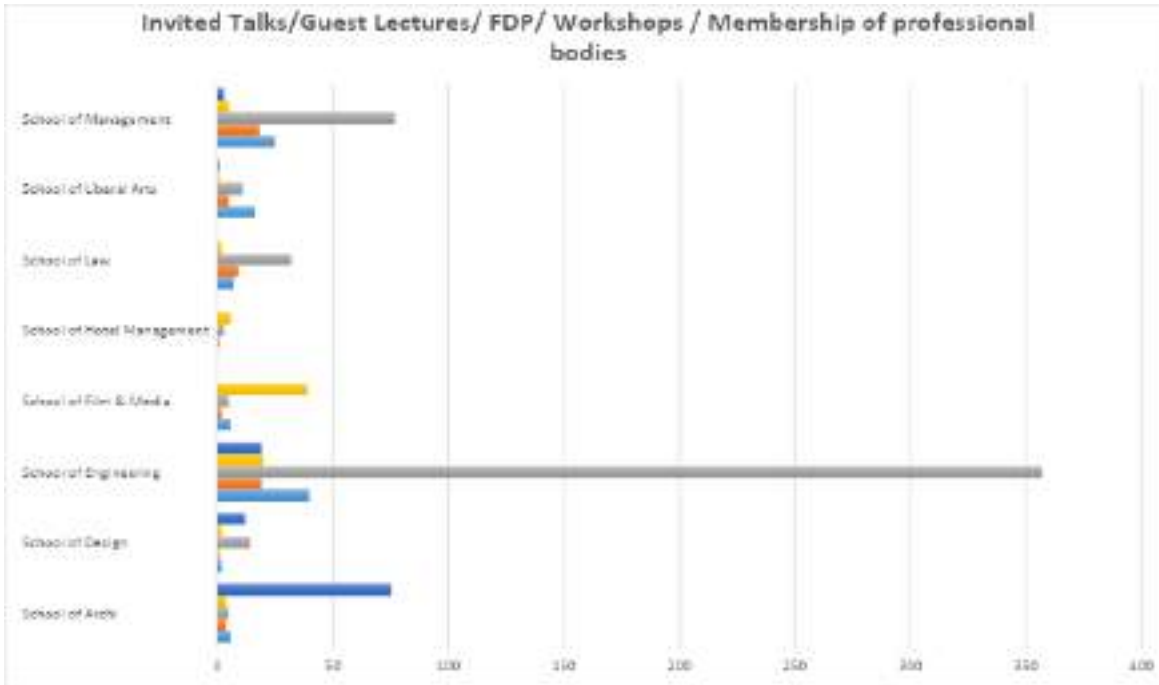
a. Faculty Development Program

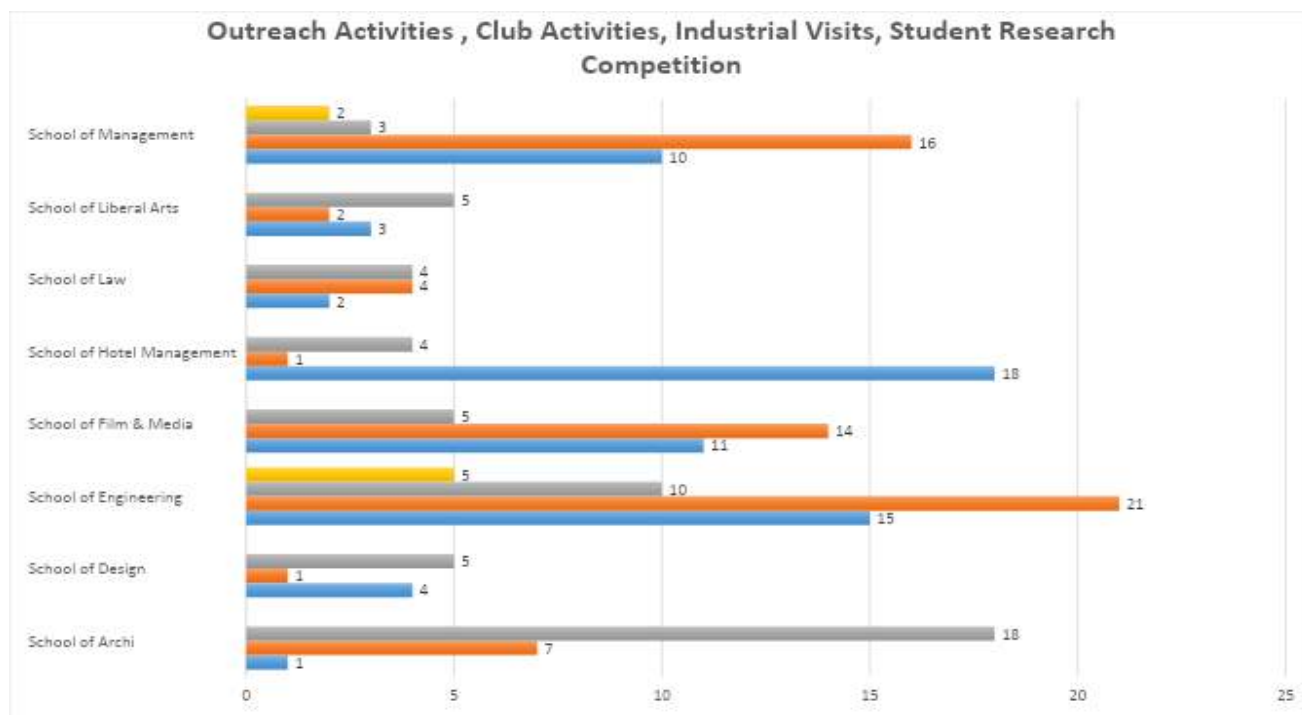

RESEARCH & DEVELOPMENT

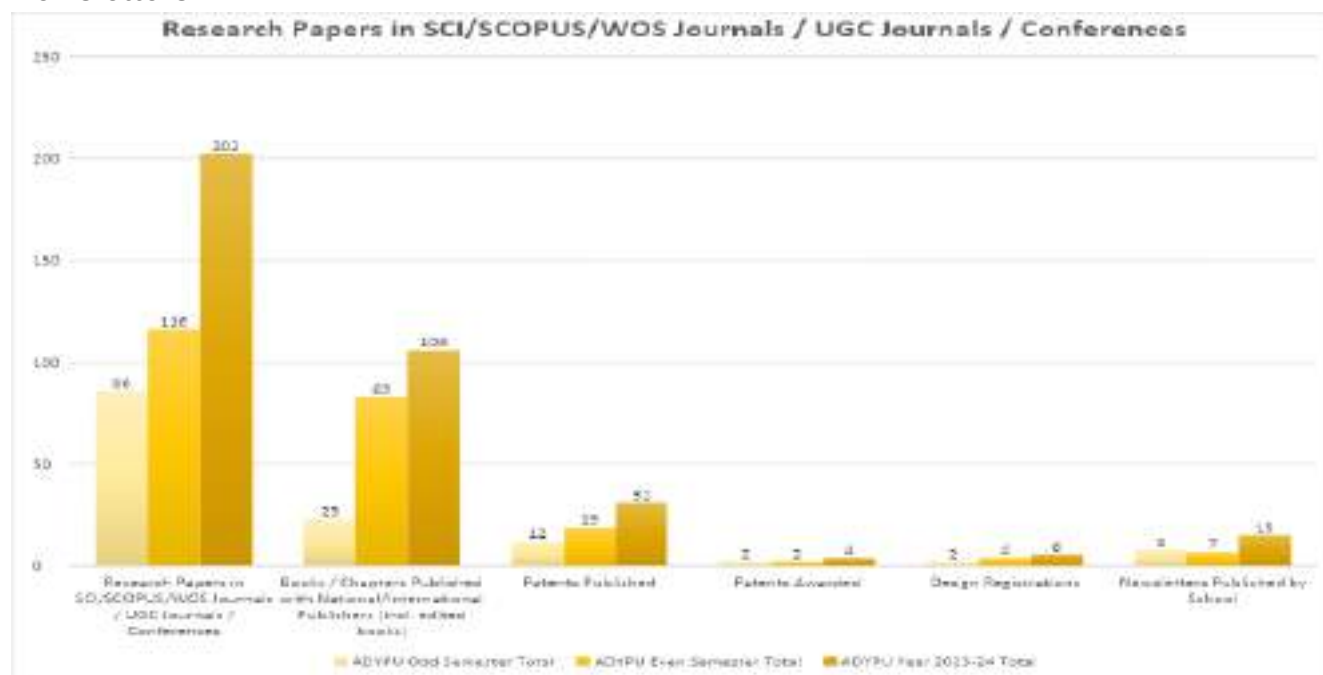

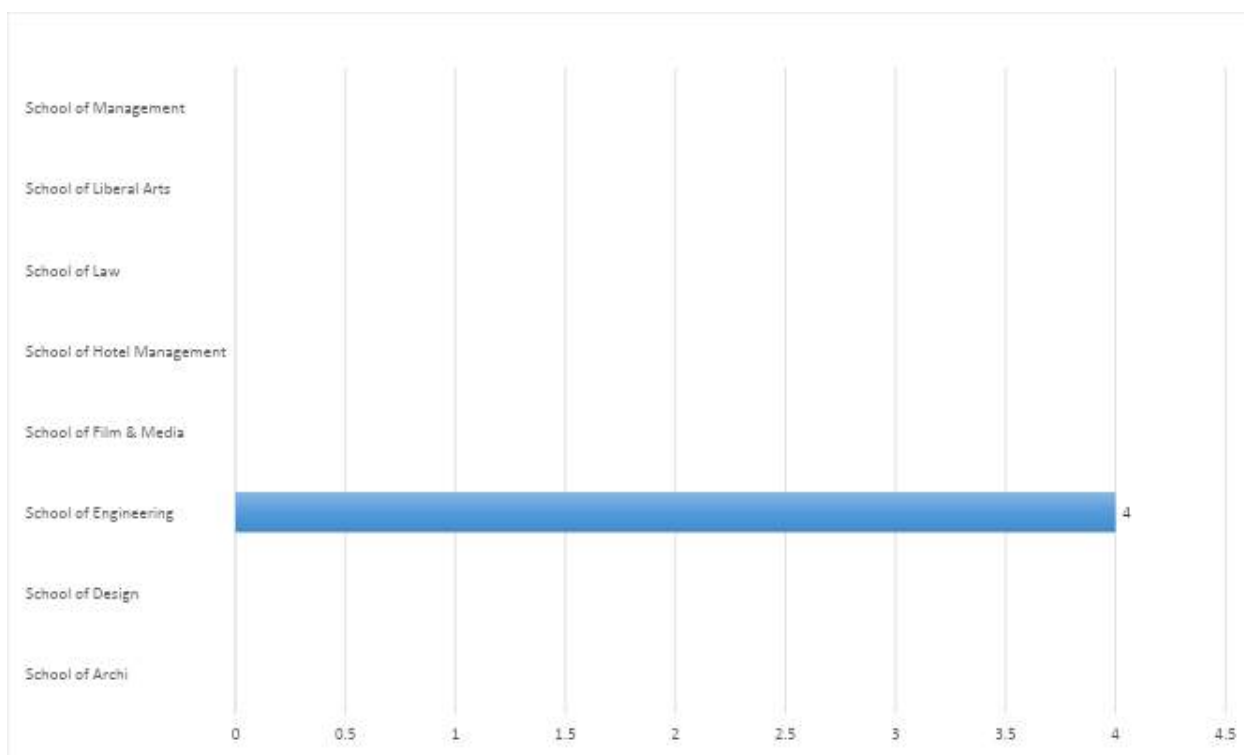

Patents Published



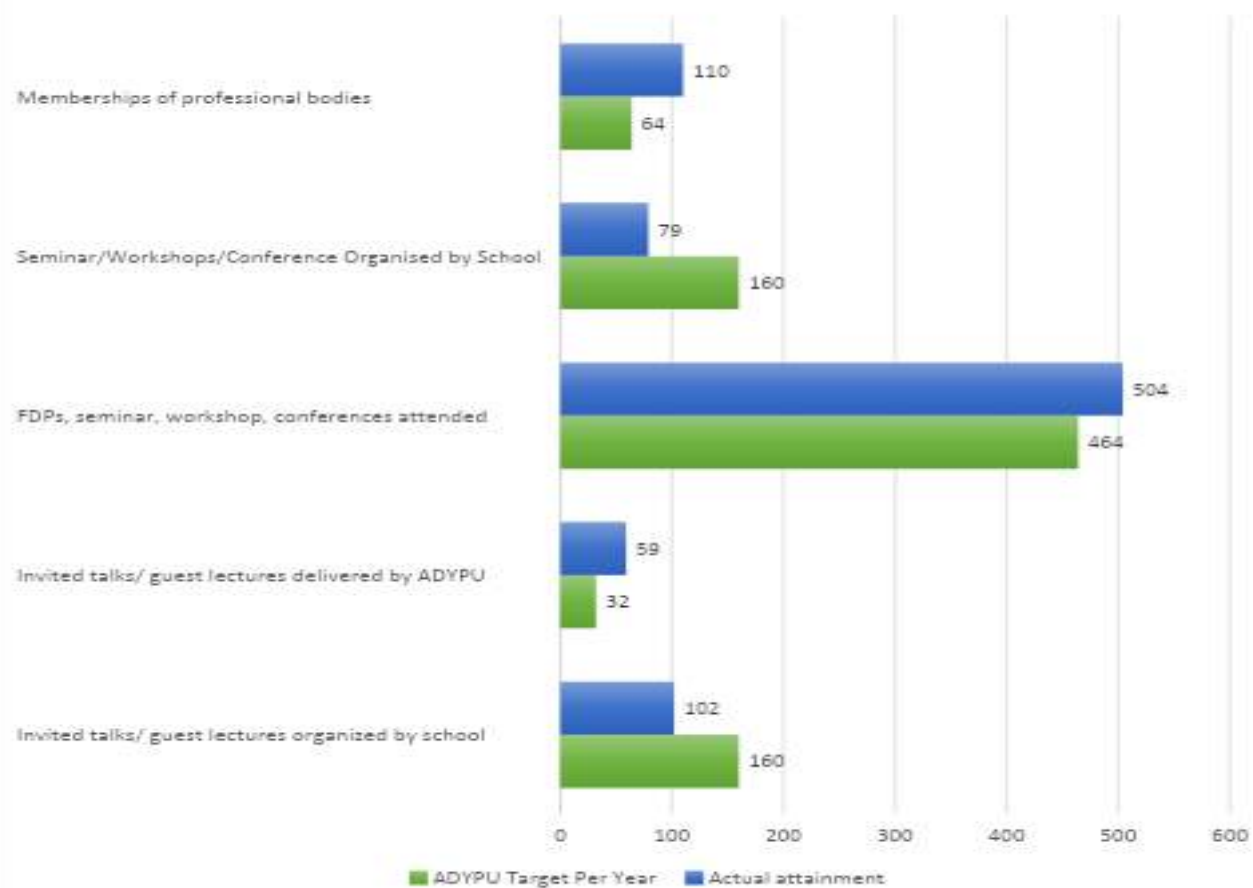

COLLABORATIONS

ADYPU actively engages in international collaborations with leading universities, research institutions, industry partners, and organizations worldwide, enhancing academic exchange, research partnerships, and student mobility. These collaborations foster global learning experiences and interdisciplinary knowledge advancement. Academic partnerships with prestigious institutions offer joint research opportunities and study abroad programs, enriching students' cross-cultural learning. Research collaborations span diverse fields, driving innovation and knowledge exchange. Industry partnerships provide practical skills through industry-aligned programs and projects. Additionally, international conferences, workshops, and faculty exchange programs promote global academic collaboration and professional development. These global partnerships are integral to ADYPU's mission to cultivate future leaders and innovators capable of addressing global challenges.

During the 2023-2024 academic year, Ajeenkya D Y Patil University (ADYPU) established collaborations with several universities and institutions. Notable partnerships include:

University of Wales Trinity Saint David (UWTSD), UK: In April 2023, ADYPU signed a Memorandum of Understanding (MoU) with UWTSD to exchange expertise in healthcare technology and systems. This collaboration focuses on delivering postgraduate health technology programs at ADYPU, aiming to produce professionals equipped for the healthcare sector in India.

Regarding new centers established on campus, ADYPU inaugurated the Center for Advanced Indian Sciences on Dussehra during the auspicious Abhijit Muhurat. This center is dedicated to exploring and preserving India's rich scientific heritage and promoting innovative research based on traditional knowledge.

These initiatives reflect ADYPU's commitment to expanding its academic collaborations and enhancing research infrastructure to provide students with diverse learning opportunities.

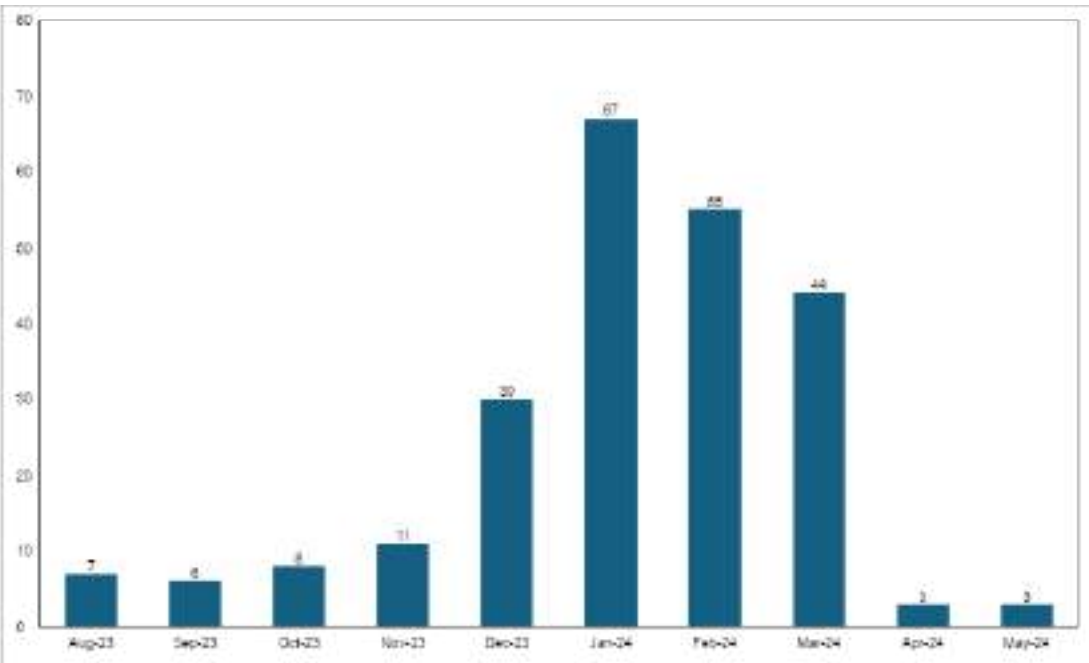


WEEK WISE PLACEMENT TRENDS

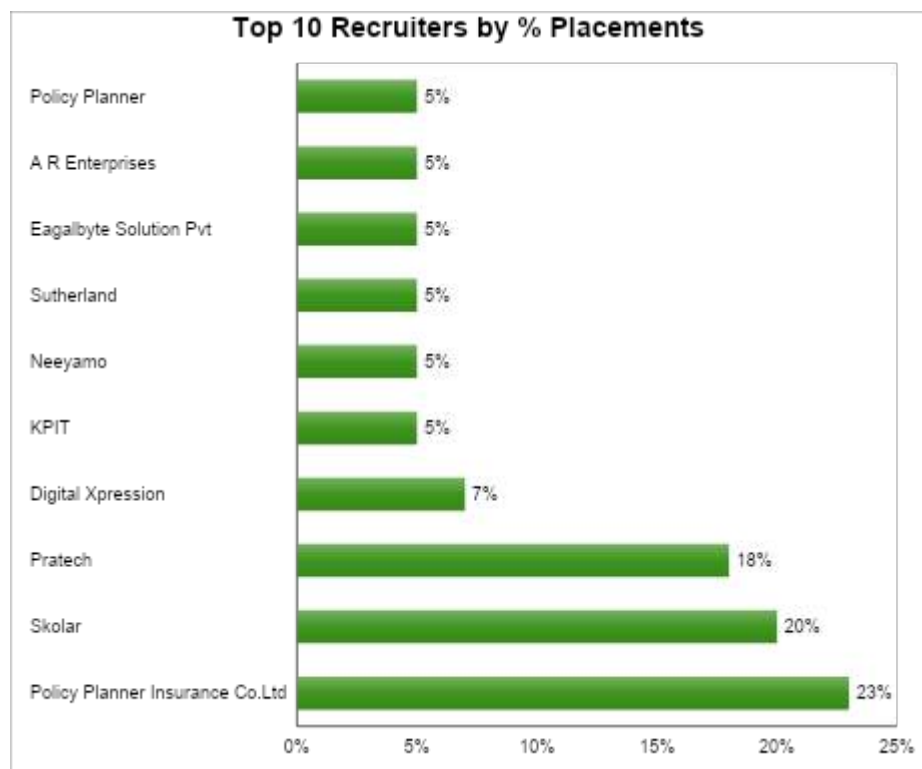


MONTHWISE PLACEMENT TRENDS

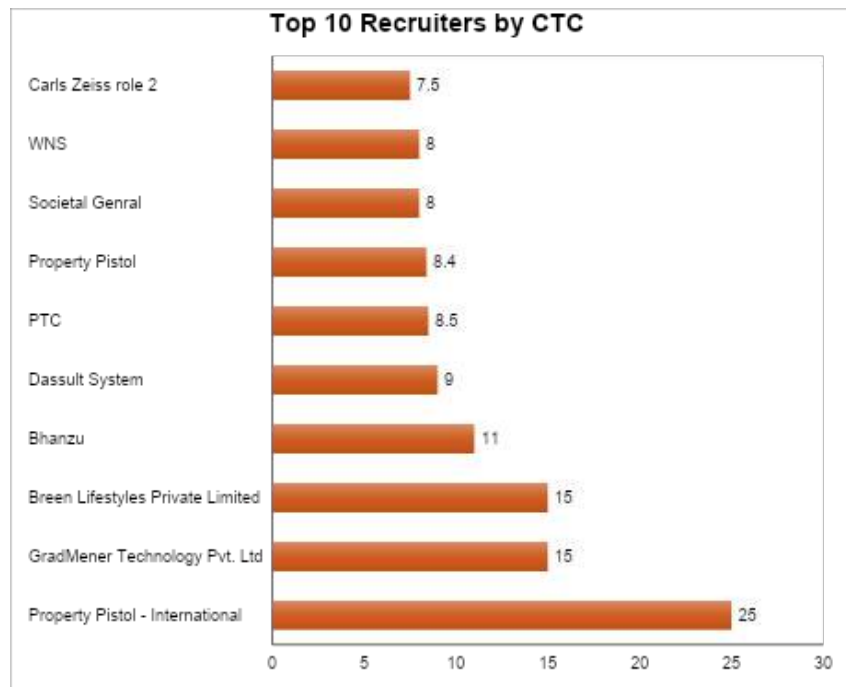

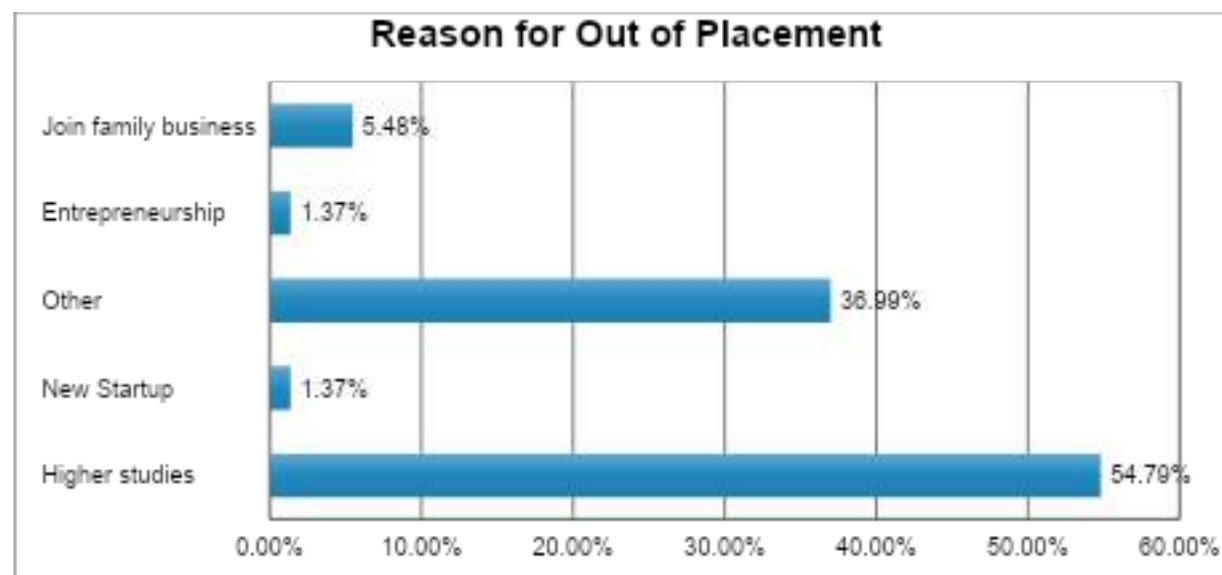

Activities & Initiatives:

Inauguration of NSS Annual Camp: The inauguration ceremony for the NSS annual camp at Solu Village School on January 29, 2024, successfully promoted community engagement, leadership, and social responsibility among participants. The event included speeches and project assignments focused on addressing local needs through environmental, educational, and health initiatives. The outcomes were enhanced teamwork, cultural exchange, and a deeper awareness of local issues, empowering participants to contribute positively to society.



Clean-up Drive: The clean-up drive conducted on January 29, 2024, at public places outside the school campus aimed to improve environmental cleanliness, promote waste management awareness, and foster community pride. The event involved organized efforts from volunteers and collaboration with local authorities. The outcomes included a cleaner environment, heightened awareness about proper waste disposal, increased community involvement, and a positive impact on local health and well-being.

Talk by Bodhankar Sir: The talk by Mr. Vinod Bodhankar on January 29, 2024, at Solu Village School focused on the critical issue of plastic pollution in oceans. The objectives were to highlight the efforts of Sagarmitra in plastic waste management, discuss the effects of plastic on marine habitats, and raise societal awareness about these environmental challenges. The objectives were to educate students about wastewater recycling, raise awareness about water conservation, and empower them with knowledge of various greywater treatment techniques. The lecture highlighted the importance of sustainable practices, discussed the broader implications for water management, and encouraged critical thinking about the environmental, social, and economic benefits of greywater reuse.

Janjagruti: The Janjagruti rally held on January 30, 2024, at Shree Sant Muktabai Madhyamik Vidyalaya in Solu, aimed to raise awareness about water conservation and the importance of girls' education and protection. The rally featured vibrant slogans and banners, uniting the community in support of the causes "Save Water, Save Future" and "Girls' Education, Save Girl Child." The event successfully heightened awareness, mobilized community support, and fostered a sense of unity in addressing these critical social and environmental issues. The rally empowered individuals to advocate for change and sparked ongoing discussions and actions within the community for water conservation and gender equality.

Trench Excavation: The Trench Excavation activity on January 31, 2024, at Shree Sant Muktabai Madhyamik Vidyalaya in Solu, aimed to provide practical experience in trench digging while fostering teamwork among NSS volunteers. The activity involved detailed preparation, including safety briefings and tool collection, followed by careful excavation of the trench according to specified dimensions. Volunteers worked in teams, adhering to safety guidelines and taking turns to dig, ensuring the trench was dug to the correct depth and dimensions. The activity concluded with cleaning up the site and proper disposal of materials. The outcomes included a successfully excavated trench, practical trench digging experience, and enhanced teamwork skills among the participants.

Tree Plantation: On January 31, 2024, from 09:30 AM to 12:30 PM, NSS volunteers at Sant Muktabai Madhyamik Vidhyalay executed a tree plantation project aimed at restoring the mountain slope's ecological balance. Volunteers planted native saplings in pre-dug trenches, enriching the soil with topsoil and compost, and securing each sapling with stakes and protective cages. The project is designed to prevent soil erosion, improve air quality, and support local wildlife, ultimately fostering a self-sustaining ecosystem and setting a precedent for future environmental stewardship.

Talk on Legal Aid Awareness: On January 31, 2024, from 02:30 PM to 04:00 PM at Sant Muktabai Madhyamik Vidhyalay, the NSS camp hosted a Talk on Legal Aid Awareness, led by Prof. Sambhaji Mohite. The session aimed to educate volunteers about the importance of legal aid, especially for underprivileged individuals who may

lack awareness or resources to access justice. Prof. Mohite used real-life scenarios to illustrate how legal aid can provide crucial support, from understanding contracts to legal representation. The interactive session empowered volunteers with knowledge about available resources and fostered a deeper understanding of their role in advocating for justice, equipping them to better support their communities.

Janjagruti Skit: On January 31, 2024, from 05:00 PM to 06:00 PM, Sant Muktabai Madhyamik Vidhyalay hosted a Janjagruti Skit, performed by NSS volunteers. The skit aimed to raise awareness about a key social issue—such as the importance of voting or women's empowerment—while fostering teamwork and creativity among the volunteers. Prior to the performance, volunteers crafted a compelling script, designed costumes and props, and rehearsed diligently. As the skit unfolded, it engaged both the camp participants and local villagers with humor and drama, effectively sparking discussions and generating enthusiasm. The interactive session that followed allowed for further exchange of ideas and brainstorming, highlighting the potential for future performances to extend the reach of the awareness message.

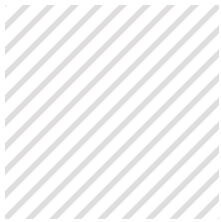

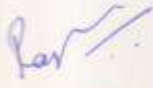
