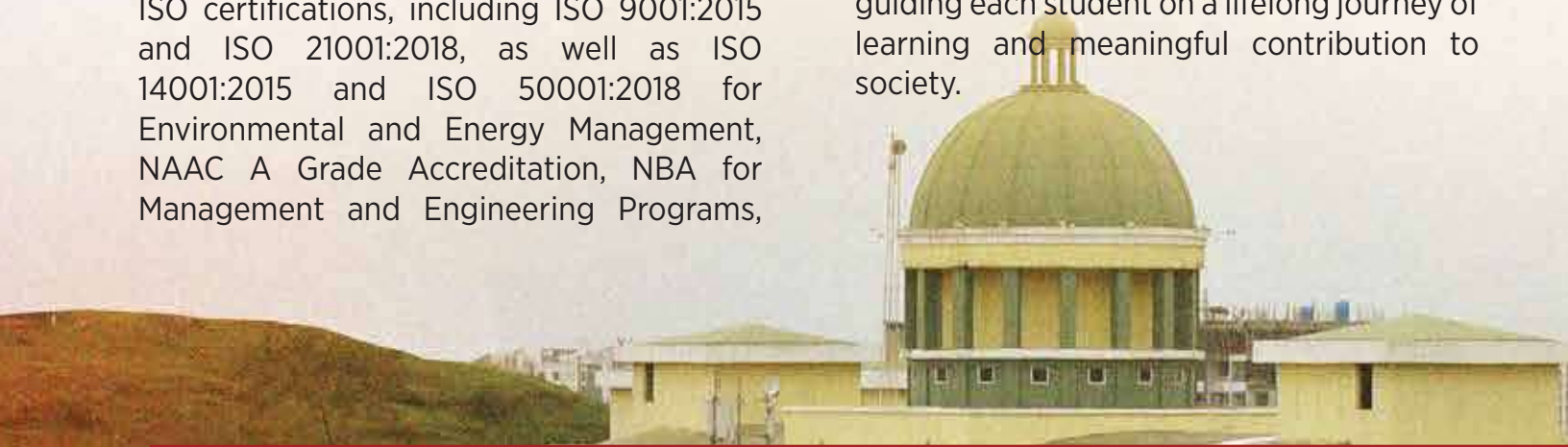

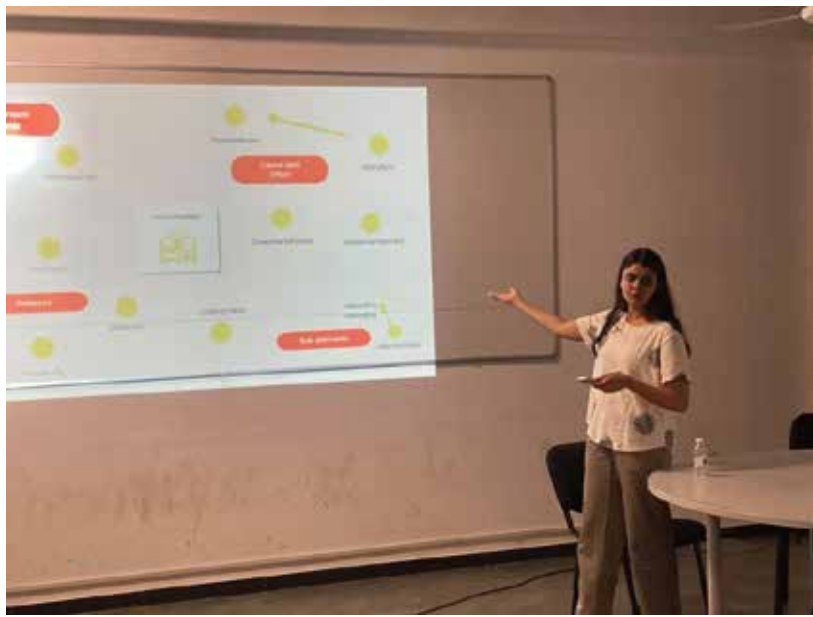


## **6. Event Name:** Experiential Card Game Workshop

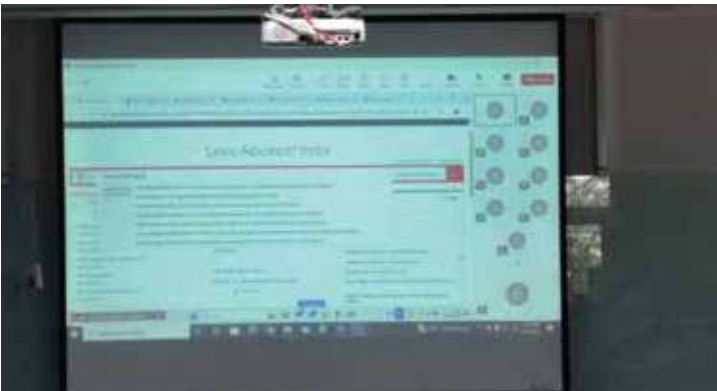

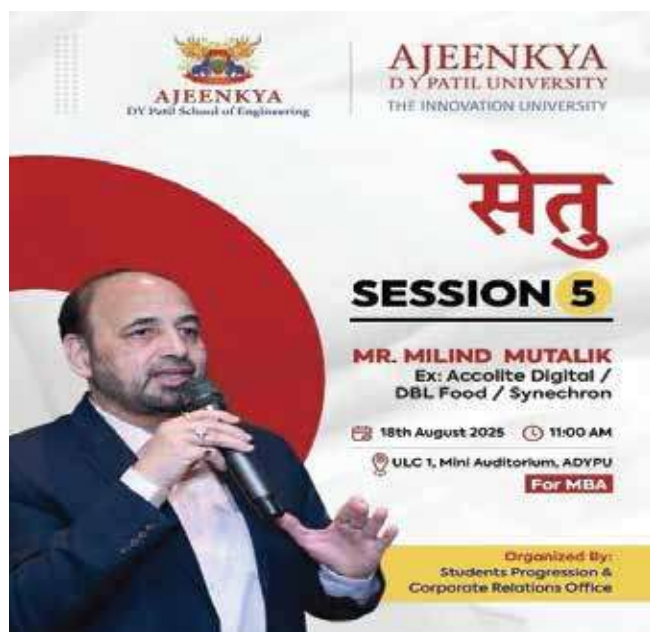

As an innovative and forward-looking university, Ajeenkya D Y Patil University (ADYPU), through its Examinations Office, continually strives to adopt progressive methods and implement efficient processes that enhance the effectiveness, transparency, and fairness of assessments.

The following are a few highlights from the Academic Year 2023-24:

- Introduction of a Scribe Writer Block for the differently abled students AND for students with any form of temporary physical challenges during end term examination.
- Creation of Medal Winners criteria from the upcoming Convocation 2025 onwards.

## **2.0 Secured Printing of student transcripts, Degree Certificate and Question Papers**

- All student transcripts and degree certificates are printed within the ADYPU premises under a highly secured environment, incorporating multiple security features to ensure authenticity and prevent duplication.
- All types of question papers are printed using advanced security measures in a confidential and secure setup, followed by tamper-proof packing and handling procedures to maintain the secrecy and sanctity of the examination process.

## **3.0 National Academic Depository**

- As per guidelines of the Ministry of HRD – Government of India, NAD Digi Locker platform is being used by academic institutions for safekeeping academic awards in Digital Format.
- University successfully uploaded all Degree Certificates on the NAD Digi Locker portal.
- The Digital Certificate contains QR code through which the Certificate can be verified digitally and easily.
- Total transcripts uploaded count in Digi Locker is 24892 in (9425 in AY 2024-25)
- Total Degree Certificates uploaded in Digi Locker are 4450 in (1048 in AY 2024-25)
- Total ABC ID created by students is 10467. (since AY 2024-25)

## **4.0 Examination Manual**

- An examination manual May 2025 is updated and documented for university examination processes and policies (soft copy).
- The manual will serve as a ready reference for the Office of Controller of Examinations various functions, operations and standard formats.

## 5.0 Development in ERP

The following developments have taken place in ERP in the last six months:

- ❑ **Introduction of Student Examination Form:** Implemented during the Odd Term Examination 2024 onwards.
- ❑ **Revised Format of Student Provisional Certificate:** The format of the provisional certificate has been updated with result date and digital sign of Controller of Examinations.
- ❑ **Distribution of Provisional Certificates:** Provisional certificates have been distributed to all students who passed the 2024-25 examinations.
- ❑ **Development of Student Gazette:** Program-wise and school-wise student gazettes, including detailed marks, have been developed for official result documentation purposes which will be duly signed by concern authorities.
- ❑ **Marks Entry Based on Examination Form Approval:** Marks entry for all courses is now linked with the approval of the student's examination form.
- ❑ **Remarks in Transcripts for Transfer and Lateral Entry Cases:** In cases of University transfer, Diploma admission in DSE, or lateral entry, appropriate remarks are included in student transcripts for better clarity and understanding.
- ❑ **Question Paper Mechanism Enhancement:** A structured mechanism for question paper management has been developed in ERP for improved clarity and process efficiency.
- ❑ **Concern Sheet Availability:** Concern sheets with student details and marks are now downloadable for the student consent process in Faculty login.
- ❑ **Subject-Wise Summary for End term Examination Conduction:** Based on student examination forms, subject-wise summaries are provided to respective schools to facilitate smooth examination conduction.
- ❑ **Development of Student Grievance Portal:** A grievance portal has been developed in ERP for students to raise queries related to examination results.
- ❑ **Correction of Student Names on Transcripts:** Student names now appear on term-wise transcripts exactly as per their 12th/Diploma/Degree mark sheets.
- ❑ **Introduction of Examination Seat Numbers:** From the Odd Term Examination (2025–26) onward, examination seat numbers will be introduced for all schools.
- ❑ **Question Paper Setter Office Order Mechanism:** A mechanism for generating office orders for question paper setters has been developed and will be introduced from the upcoming Odd Term Examination (December 2025).

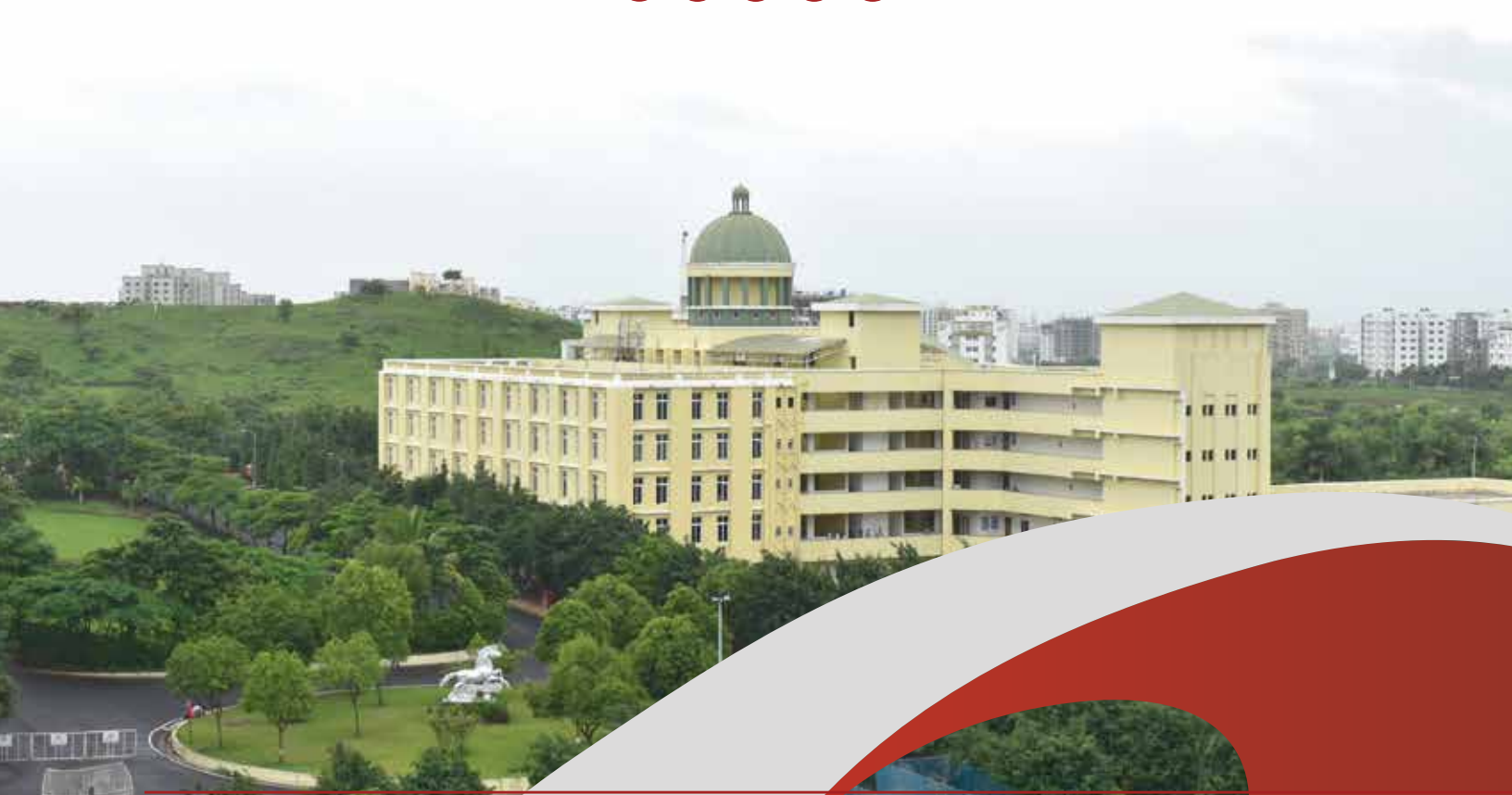
