1. About the establishment and objectives of the Maharashtra National Law University, Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar:

Realising the importance of quality legal education and need for well-trained Law graduates for the Bar and Bench, the Government of Maharashtra took a decision to establish three National Law Universities in the State of Maharashtra at Mumbai, Nagpur and Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar in the years 2015, 2016 and 2017 respectively. All the three National Law Universities are independent and autonomous in nature and are established by virtue of the Maharashtra National Law University Act, 2014.

The Maharashtra National Law University, Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar (MNLU, CS) commenced its academic activities from 16th March, 2017. The MNLU-CS, being an institution of national importance, has fulfilled the aspirations of the people of the Marathwada Region. The University has its own 50 acres lush green campus situated near Kanchanwadi area at Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar.

By virtue of the Statute, the Chief Justice of India or his nominee who shall be a senior Judge of the Supreme Court is the Chancellor of the University and the Chief Justice of High Court of Bombay is the Pro-Chancellor of the University.

2. Objectives of the University:

The Maharashtra National Law University, Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar was established to achieve the following objectives:

- To advance and disseminate learning and knowledge of law and legal processes and their role in national development;
- To impart specialized and systematic instruction, training and research in systems of law and for the matters connected therewith or incidental thereto.
- To develop in the students and research scholars, a sense of responsibility, to serve society in the field of law by developing skills in regard to advocacy, legal services, legislation, law reforms and the like;
- To organize lectures, seminars, symposia and conferences to promote legal knowledge and to make law and legal processes efficient instruments of social development;
- To hold examinations and confer degrees and other academic distinctions.

*Note - The University was renamed from Maharashtra National Law University, Aurangabad (MNLU Aurangabad) to Maharashtra National Law University, Chhatrapati Sambhajanagar (MNLU-CS) in 2025. References to MNLU Aurangabad in this Report pertain to the period prior to the renaming and may be read accordingly.

Justice Abhay Shreeniwas Oka Born on 25th May, 1960. Did B.Sc., LL.M. (University Of Bombay). Enrolled as an Advocate on 28th June, 1983. Started practising in Thane District Court in the chamber of his father Shreeniwas W. Oka. In 1985-86, he joined the chamber of Shri V. P. Tipnis, a former Judge of the Bombay High Court and former LokAyukta. Appeared in several important matters and in public interest litigations. Elevated as Additional Judge of the Bombay High Court on 29th August, 2003. Appointed as a permanent Judge from 12th November 2005. He took oath as The Chief Justice of High Court of Karnataka on 10th May 2019 and he took oath as Judge of Supreme Court of India on 31st August 2021.

Hon'ble Shri Justice Prasanna B. Varale

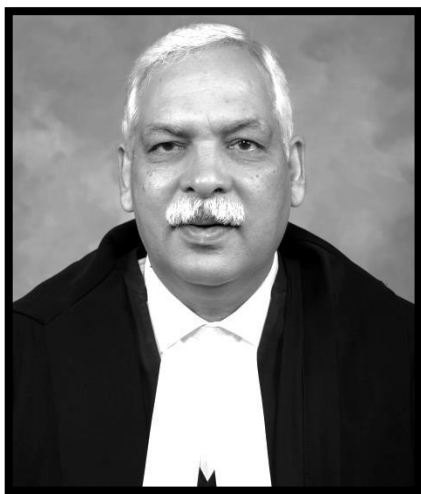
Judge, Supreme Court of India &

Hon'ble Shri Justice Prasanna Bhalachandra Varale was born on 23rd June 1962 at Nippani. He pursued his schooling and degree level studies at various places in Maharashtra, such as Shahada, Shirpur, Nashik, Sangli, Buldhana, Latur and Nanded. After completion of his LLB from Dr. Babasaheb Ambedkar University, Hon'ble Shri. Justice Prasanna B. Varale started practicing in the High Court of Bombay, Aurangabad Bench. He joined the chambers of renowned lawyer Shri. Satyanarayan Loya and practiced on both civil as well as criminal side at High Court Bench at Aurangabad. He also served as a Lecturer in Law at Dr. Ambedkar Law College, Aurangabad from 1990 to 1992. Hon'ble Shri. Justice Prasanna B. Varale also worked as Assistant Government Pleader and Additional Public Prosecutor at High Court Bench at Aurangabad. He was Additional Standing Counsel for the Union of India. Hon'ble Shri. Justice Prasanna B. Varale was elevated to the Bombay High Court on 18th July 2008. He assumed the charge as Chief Justice of High Court of Karnataka on 15th October 2022.

On 25th January 2024, he was sworn in as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India.

He is due to retire on 22nd June 2027.

Chief Justice, Hon'ble High Court of Bombay
& Pro-Chancellor, MNLU-CS (Till January, 2025)

Born on 16th June 1965 at Muskarai, District Ambedkar Nagar, Uttar Pradesh. Had his college education in Colvin Taluqdars' College, Lucknow. Graduated in laws (LL.B.) in the year 1991 from Lucknow University. Enrolled as an Advocate on 11th May 1991 and joined chambers of his father - Shri R.A. Upadhyaya - practicing at Board of Revenue for last sixty years, Shri Mohd Arif Khan, Senior Advocate and Shri S.K. Kalia, Senior Advocate. Mainly practised in Civil and Constitutional sides at High Court of Judicature at Allahabad, at Lucknow.

Was appointed as the Chief Standing Counsel, State of U.P. in May 2007 and continued to hold that office till elevation as Judge of the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad. Appointed as a puisne Judge of the High Court of Judicature at Allahabad on 21st November 2011 and took oath as the permanent Judge of High Court of Judicature at Allahabad on 6th August 2013. Became Senior Judge of the Lucknow Bench on 28th March 2023.

Appointed and took oath as the Chief Justice of the High Court of Bombay on 29th July 2023.

& Pro-Chancellor, MNLU-CS (From January, 2025)

Born on 13.04.1964. Studied B.Sc. and LL.B. Enrolled as Advocate on 12.07.1988. Practiced on Civil and Constitutional, Arbitration and Company matters in the High Court of Madhya Pradesh. Designated as Senior Advocate in April, 2007.

Revised the 5th and 6th Editions of Principles of Administrative Law by M.P. Jain and S.N. Jain and 15th Edition of Principles of Statutory Interpretation by late Honourable Justice G.P. Singh, Former Chief Justice of High Court of Madhya Pradesh. Appointed as Additional Judge of the High Court of Madhya Pradesh on 29.12.2009 and Permanent Judge on 15.02.2011.

Transferred to High Court of Jammu and Kashmir and took oath as such on 20.09.2016. Appointed as Acting Chief Justice of High Court of Jammu and Kashmir on 11.05.2018 and functioned as such up to 10.08.2018.

On transfer to Karnataka High Court, His Lordship took oath as Judge of Karnataka High Court on 17.11.2018. His Lordship assumed charge as the Acting Chief Justice of Karnataka High Court on 03.07.2022 and functioned as such up to 14.10.2022. Served as President of Bangalore Mediation Centre, Arbitration and Conciliation Centre and President of Karnataka Judicial Academy.

Appointed as Chief Justice, High Court for the State of Telangana on 19.07.2023 and took oath of office on 23.07.2023. Transferred as the Chief Justice of High Court of Bombay and assumed charge as such on 21.01.2025 afternoon. Elevated as a Judge of the Supreme Court of India on 29th August, 2025.

Prof. Dr. A. Lakshminath is a distinguished legal academician, administrator, researcher, and teacher with over five decades of service to legal education. He has served as the Founder Vice-Chancellor of Chanakya National Law University, Patna, Founder Chancellor of D.S. National Law University, Visakhapatnam, and held several leadership positions at NALSAR University of Law, Andhra University, and Nagpur University.

A prolific scholar, Prof. Lakshminath has guided more than 130 Ph.D. scholars, 18 LL.D. candidates, and over 550 LL.M. dissertations. He has authored/co-authored 14 books and over 215 research articles and has served as editor of several reputed law journals. His contributions to legal education, research, clinical legal education, legal aid, human rights awareness, and public policy have earned him national and international recognition.

He is the recipient of numerous prestigious honours, including the Prof. N.R. Madhava Menon Best Law Teacher Award (2012) for SAARC Countries, the Dr. S. Radhakrishnan Education Award (2008), and the Lifetime Achievement Award conferred by International Educators for World Peace, USA. Widely respected for his scholarship and leadership, Prof. Lakshminath continues to be regarded as one of the foremost contributors to legal education in India.

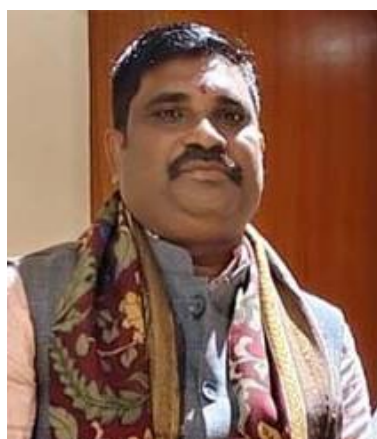
Aurangabad, external academicians and senior faculty members, reviewed the circulated agenda paper and provided their insights and approvals on the proposed agenda.

Academic and Research Accomplishments of faculty members in the year 2024-25:



Prof. (Dr.) Kondaiah Jonnalagadda, Professor of Law, actively contributed to academic, administrative, and research activities during the year. He taught several undergraduate and postgraduate courses including International Investment Law, Corporate Crime and Ethics, Capital Markets and Securities Law, Private International Law, and Company Law, completing the prescribed syllabus for all courses. In addition to teaching, he undertook important examination responsibilities such as serving as a member of the Moderation Committee, acting as an examination observer, and chairing the Unfair Means Committee to ensure fairness and discipline in the examination process.

Apart from teaching, he performed various examination-related duties throughout the year. He served as a Member of the Moderation Committee, responsible for moderating question papers, and also acted as an Observer for examinations. Additionally, he chaired the Unfair Means Committee, conducting meetings related to examination malpractice and ensuring fairness and discipline in the examination process. These responsibilities were fully carried out in both academic semesters.

Prof. Jonnalagadda also made significant administrative and institutional contributions. During the reporting period, he served as Head of the Department and Dean (UG). He was actively involved in various statutory and academic committees of the university, including the Academic Council, Doctoral and Research Committee, Board of Studies, IQAC, Library Committee, Anti-Ragging Committee, and PG Academic and Examination Committee. In addition, he served as SPOC for SWAYAM, mentor to students, and contributed to institutional activities such as seminars, convocations, and other academic events.

In the field of research and publications, Prof. Jonnalagadda published several research articles in reputed legal journals on topics related to arbitration law, cross-border insolvency, privacy in the digital age, and corporate insolvency. He also authored a textbook titled “Introduction to Securities Law”, published in December 2025, further contributing to academic literature in the field of corporate and securities law.

His role in research supervision, where he guided eight PhD scholars, out of which three candidates submitted their theses, and supervised five LL.M. dissertation scholars. This demonstrates his active role in mentoring postgraduate and doctoral research students.

Furthermore, Prof. Jonnalagadda participated in several faculty development programmes, conferences, workshops, and international webinars during the year. He delivered lectures and participated as a speaker, panelist, or session chair on topics related to legal technology, corporate ethics, intellectual property, and sustainable development, organized by various national and international institutions.



Prof. A. Subrahmanyam, Professor of Law and Dean (Research), actively contributed to teaching, research supervision, academic administration, and scholarly engagement during the year. He taught Comparative Public Law and Legal Research Methodology at the postgraduate level and Banking Law at the undergraduate level. His teaching involved lectures supported by presentations, seminar work, and project-based assessments, ensuring both conceptual understanding and research-oriented learning among students. The full syllabus for all courses was completed during the academic period.

In addition to teaching, he undertook important examination responsibilities, serving as Chairman of the Moderation Committee. In this role, he supervised and moderated question papers for various programmes including LL.M., Executive MBA, and PG Diploma in Water Law and Policy, ensuring academic standards and fairness in the examination process. These responsibilities were carried out during both academic semesters.

Prof. Subrahmanyam also played a vital role in research supervision and academic mentorship. As Dean (Research), he was actively involved in monitoring and strengthening the research culture of the institution. He conducted semester progress presentations for Ph.D. scholars, where doctoral candidates presented updates on their ongoing research work. These contributions are part of a reputed academic publication that analyses major legislative and judicial developments in Indian law and provides critical commentary on contemporary legal issues. Through such publications, he contributes to ongoing academic discourse and the documentation of significant legal developments in India.

In addition, he participated in academic knowledge-sharing activities by delivering an invited lecture on “Consumer Protection Act, 2019 and Legal Issues” at a National Seminar on Empowering Consumer for Viksit Bharat@2047, organized by the Indian Institute of Public Administration (IIPA), Delhi, on 25 April 2025. This lecture addressed contemporary challenges in consumer protection law and contributed to broader academic and policy discussions on strengthening consumer rights and regulatory frameworks.

Overall, his academic engagement reflects sustained involvement in teaching, examination moderation, research supervision, scholarly publication, and invited academic lectures. Through these activities, he has contributed meaningfully to the advancement of legal education, the promotion of research culture, and the overall academic development of the institution.



Prof. (Dr.) M. Sarojanamma, Professor of Law, made significant academic contributions through teaching, examination work, research supervision, and academic development activities during the year. She taught several important law subjects including Constitutional Law–I, Constitutional Law–II, Environmental Law, and Fundamental Rights and Directive Principles to undergraduate and postgraduate students. Her teaching methodology included lectures supported by presentations, classroom discussions, and continuous internal assessment through assignments and project presentations. Through these methods, she ensured effective student engagement and completed the full prescribed syllabus for the courses assigned to her.

Alongside teaching, she undertook various examination-related responsibilities. These included the evaluation of answer scripts for mid-semester and end-semester examinations of several programmes such as BA LL.B., BBA LL.B., and LL.M. courses. The evaluation work covered subjects like Constitutional Law and Environmental Law, and these responsibilities were carried out fully in accordance with the academic requirements of the university. Her involvement helped maintain the integrity and smooth functioning of the university's evaluation process.

She also played an important role in research guidance and academic mentorship. During the year, she supervised multiple postgraduate dissertations. The research topics guided by her included areas such as religious freedom and gender equality in India, judicial approaches to secularism, and the right to equal opportunity under the Directive Principles of State Policy with particular reference to free legal aid. In addition to LL.M. dissertations, she supervised research in the field of Medical Laws and Hospital Management, including a study examining patient satisfaction and hospital management systems in a multi-specialty hospital. These research works were successfully completed and the respective degrees were awarded, reflecting her active contribution to postgraduate research training.

Furthermore, she participated in academic development and training initiatives. Notably, she was associated with a Capacity Building Programme organized by Maharashtra National Law University, Chhatrapati Sambhajinagar, conducted from 11 November to 17 November 2025. The programme involved numerous participants and resource persons and aimed at strengthening academic skills, research capacity, and institutional learning. Such participation contributes to the enhancement of academic collaboration and professional development within the university.

Dr. Ashok P. Wadje, Associate Professor of Law, contributed actively to teaching, academic activities, research, and professional development during the academic year. He taught several undergraduate and postgraduate courses including Jurisprudence, Family Law–I, Service Law, Intellectual Property Law, Cyber Law (optional), and Theories of Property and Personification of Artificial Intelligence. His teaching involved lectures, tutorials, practical components, and continuous student engagement through presentations and discussions. All the courses assigned to him during the academic sessions were completed as per the prescribed academic schedule.

In addition, he supervised doctoral research scholars whose theses were submitted and degrees awarded during the year.

Dr. Wadje further engaged extensively in academic conferences, seminars, and professional training programmes. He participated in a capacity-building programme on interdisciplinary perspectives in modern legal teaching and attended a faculty development programme on artificial intelligence in higher education. He also presented research papers at various national and international conferences on themes such as voyeurism as a cybercrime, the future of artificial intelligence in legal education, and privacy in the context of digital governance.

In addition, he delivered several invited lectures and expert sessions at different academic institutions on topics such as cyber law, artificial intelligence, gender justice, and digital governance. His participation as a speaker, panelist, and resource person in these events contributed to academic dialogue and knowledge dissemination in emerging areas of law and technology. He was also invited as an expert for academic discussions, research workshops, and faculty development programmes across various universities and institutions.



Dr. Abhijit Dattatraya Vasmatkar, Associate Professor of Law, joined the university on 10 June 2025 and thereafter actively contributed to teaching, academic administration, and institutional activities. Dr. Tanaya Tarai, Associate Professor of Law, contributed actively to teaching, academic administration, examination duties, and research supervision during the academic year. 7. Through its Centre for Competition Law and Policy (CCLP), the University organised a One-Day Western Region Conclave on Competition Law and Policy on 21st March, 2024, in collaboration with the Competition Commission of India (CCI). The conclave deliberated on Competition Law Amendments, Merger Control Regime, and Regulation of Digital Markets with participation from experts and students from various institutions.

Information about Student Placements:

1. During the placement season for the graduating batch of 2025, the University adopted a rolling placement process and successfully facilitated recruitment opportunities for its students through campus placement drives and professional networking initiatives.
2. A total of 45 students graduated during the year. Of these, 8 students secured placements in reputed law firms and corporate legal organizations, while 28 students opted to pursue independent legal practice and litigation. Additionally, 6 students chose to pursue higher studies and 3 students entered the judiciary sector, resulting in comprehensive career progression opportunities for all graduating students.
3. The University recorded an average annual compensation package of ₹8 lakhs per annum for students placed through campus recruitment. The placements reflect the growing confidence of the legal industry in the quality of education and professional training imparted by the University.
4. Students secured placements in leading legal organizations including Trilegal, JSA, Bharucha & Partners, DSL Legal, DSKV Legal, Wadia Ghandy & Co., and The Law Point. These placements provided opportunities in diverse practice areas such as dispute resolution, real estate, corporate transactions, banking and finance, white-collar crime, and litigation support.
5. Among the notable achievements, Mr. Parag Kabra secured placement with DSL Legal, Mumbai as an Associate in the White Collar Crimes and Dispute Resolution Team with an annual compensation package of ₹16 lakhs per annum, which was the highest package secured during the placement season.

The session focused on cyber threats, cyber hygiene, digital safety practices, and the importance of cyber awareness in contemporary society.
3. On the occasion of National Voters’ Day, the University organised a legal awareness programme on 25th January, 2024, wherein Adv. Chaitanya Dharurkar, Advocate, High Court of Bombay Bench at Aurangabad, delivered a lecture on **“We, the Voters of India: Remembering the Past, Redeeming the Future.”** The programme aimed at promoting constitutional values, electoral awareness, and responsible citizenship among students.

8. 9. 13. 24. The programme educated students and faculty members on responsible citizenship, constitutional values, environmental protection, safeguarding public property, and the promotion of harmony and scientific temper. Through interactive sessions, expert talks, and legal awareness activities, the initiative highlighted the relationship between Fundamental Rights and Fundamental Duties and encouraged active participation in nation-building.
25. On 15 March 2025, the Legal Aid Cell and Pro Bono Club organized a Jail Visit to the Central Prison, Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar for first-year students. The visit provided participants with first-hand exposure to the functioning of the prison administration, rehabilitation programmes, inmate management systems, and legal aid services available to prisoners. Students interacted with prison authorities and gained valuable insights into the rights of incarcerated persons and the practical operation of the criminal justice system. The programme helped bridge the gap between classroom learning and real-world legal practice while fostering empathy and social responsibility among future legal professionals.
26. On 29 March 2025, the Legal Aid Cell and Pro Bono Club organized an educational visit to the District and Sessions Court and the Family Court, Chhatrapati Sambhajnagar. The visit was aimed at providing practical exposure to courtroom proceedings and enhancing students' understanding of judicial processes. Participants observed court proceedings, interacted with legal professionals, and learned about the roles of judges, advocates, court staff, and legal aid institutions. The visit also enabled students to witness proceedings relating to family law matters and gain a deeper understanding of the functioning of both criminal and family justice systems.
27. Through these initiatives, the University strengthened legal awareness, constitutional literacy, civic responsibility, access-to-justice education, and experiential learning among students, thereby advancing its commitment to legal aid, community engagement, and social outreach.

1. Statement on significant accounting policies followed by the university

1.1 General information

Maharashtra National Law University was formed on 16th march 2017 under the Maharashtra National Law University Act, 2014.

1.2 Basis for Preparation of Accounting

The Accounting of the University is prepared on the basis of cash system of accounts, at some point of transactions mercantile system is adopted.

1.3 Fixed Assets

Fixed assets are inclusive of freight, duties and taxes and incidentals and direct expenses related to acquisition and installation of assets.

1.4 Depreciation

Depreciation is provided on WDV method as per rates specified in the Income Tax Act, 1961.

1.5 Investments

All investments are valued at cost except Fixed Deposits are shown at principal and interest accrued thereon.

1.6 Income tax

No provision of tax is made in the accounts.

1.7 Digitalization of Accounts

University has maintained the Accounts in Tally Prime software.



Annexure to Audit Report

1. The Accounting of the University is prepared on the basis of cash system of accounts, at some point of transactions mercantile system is adopted, overall it is a hybrid system of accounting.
2. In case of Scholarship receivable from Government the financials were shown batch wise receivables from the government however Scholarship Department maintained academic year wise receivables from the Government.
3. The University has received Government grant of Rs. 50 Cr as specific grant during the year for development of buildings which is shown in income as Government Grant received.
4. There are also Scholarship refundable to The Government, the same should be transferred to separate bank account.
5. The university is recovering contributions from employees towards NPS, but the NPS account of the employees were not opened till date. The amount received towards NPS contribution is kept in fixed deposit with bank. Instant steps should be taken to open NPS accounts.
6. The Center of excellence building, Boys hostel, Girls Hostel, Mess Building are currently under operation. The building should be capitalized in the books of accounts.
7. Fixed Assets register maintained at the university was under updation as on the date of audit.
8. Profession Tax of Rs. 7600/- was paid twice through bank but the same were not credited to bank account up to date of Audit.
